A recent <u>Huffington Post article</u> recognizes Massachusetts' innovative initiatives to reduce wasted food. In 2014, the state established the <u>Commercial Organics Waste Ban</u>, which prohibits businesses that generate one ton or more of wasted food per week from disposing of that waste in the trash. <u>RecyclingWorks</u> is a program funded by the MassDEP that helps businesses comply with this and other waste bans.

The article highlights RecyclingWorks' assistance in Lenox that helped eight small restaurants start diverting food scraps for composting, even though they were below the ban threshold.

many stories about connecting businesses with surplus food to food pantries, food banks, and other food rescue organizations. Like other food services entities, food rescue organizations generate food scraps that cannot be eaten. Recently, RecyclingWorks helped two food pantries divert food that could not be eaten from disposal.

<u>Kate's Kitchen</u> in Holyoke arranged more regular pickups with a farmer who uses food scraps for animal feed. <u>The Christian Center</u> in Pittsfield set up a system to compost food waste on-site and use the finished compost in their garden.
