National Sword is the Chinese government's new policy to limit the import of secondary mixed paper and mixed plastics. To address the uncertainty of impacts of this policy on recycling markets, Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) is evaluating the situation, communicating with impacted parties, and collaborating with other state government agencies nationwide.
