## **MassDEP RBDG Announcement**

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) Recycling Business Development Grant (RBDG) program is currently accepting applications for its 2018 grant cycle. This program is intended to help Massachusetts recycling processors and manufacturers create sustainable markets for eligible materials, and to add value to municipal and business recycling efforts.

Grant awards range from \$50,000 to \$400,000, and will be awarded in two rounds during 2018. Round One applications are due **June 29, 2018 by 5:00pm** and Round Two applications are due **October 5, 2018 by 5:00pm**. ## RecyclingWorks Spotlight: Wellesley College

Wellesley College is a private women's liberal arts college in Massachusetts with approximately 2,300 students.

Wellesley's Sustainability Coordinator contacted

RecyclingWorks seeking assistance to find a film plastic recycler when their previous service provider stopped accepting film plastic.

RecyclingWorks connected Wellesley to Trex, a manufacturer that utilizes recycled materials, such as film plastics, to produce wood-alternative decking, railings, and other outdoor items. Trex already accepts the film plastics generated at several Whole Foods Market locations for recycling, and RecyclingWorks helped Wellesley identify a recycling solution by leveraging this existing relationship. The college will now send their film plastics to the nearest Whole Foods Market, where the material can be combined with the grocer's film plastics and sent to Trex for recycling.
