# **CONTAMINATION GRADING SYSTEM**



## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE GRADING SYSTEM

The following recycling contamination grading system was developed as an informal training tool to help evaluate the quality of the material you are collecting and to highlight potential issues with your waste diversion programs. It was created based on conversations with one materials recovery facility (MRF) in Massachusetts, and may not apply to all businesses and institutions.

Please check with your hauler and/or end site to learn about their specific contamination thresholds, as this may vary. Haulers often provide guidance about what is an acceptable amount of contamination in terms of a percentage by weight or volume.

Remember that your hauler's driver determines whether a load is rejected or requires added fees because of contamination. When asking for feedback from your hauler and end site, photos can be a helpful tool for identifying specific contaminants and improving the quality of your collected material.



#### **GRADE A**





Indicates very limited or zero contamination, wet or dry.

### **GRADE B**







Indicates some incorrect sorting, a very small amount of food contamination, or liquid contained inside a bottle

#### **GRADE C**





Indicates many incorrectly sorted materials or some liquid/food contamination

### **GRADE F**







Indicates high levels of contamination that would be difficult to remove

## Answer: Grade B

Small amounts of contained liquid contamination, plastic bags





How would you classify the contents of this recycling dumpster?









## Answer: Grade F

Recyclables should not be bagged, incorrectly sorted materials within bags (ex: gloves, film plastic)

Answer: Grade A

Only a few straws, no food/liquid contamination









How would you classify the contents of this recycling bin?





Answer: Grade C

Visible liquid contamination, incorrectly sorted items (ex: straws, utensils, chip bags)







How would you classify the contents of this bin?





Answer: Grade F







How would you classify the contents of this organics bin?









## Answer: Grade C

Many plastic gloves, parchment paper may not be accepted by your organics end site





This is your trash dumpster. Can you spot the waste ban items?







Cardboard, paper, and yard waste are all waste ban items.
